

Venture Richmond provides enhanced property management services for a 440-block business improvement district comprising Downtown and the northern Riverfront.

### Clean, Safe & Green

**1M+** gallons of litter, leaves and weeds removed from Downtown

- 25,000 hours of sidewalk cleaning
- **263** planters and hanging baskets, 83 blocks beautified Downtown

### **Riverfront Maintenance and Visitation**

**80,000** pounds of litter, trash, and debris removed from the Canal Walk and Brown's Island
